What is an Agricultural Tie?

More commonly known as an 'AG TAG '...

An Agricultural Occupancy Condition (AOC), or agricultural tie, is a condition of planning, set by the local planning authority. They enable local authorities to set aside their resistance to new home developments in the countryside and grant planning permission, where there is a genuine agricultural business need.

The key condition of an 'ag tag' is that the owners of the property are either agricultural employees (and their dependants), or their widow or widower.

In simple terms, an occupancy condition is an instrument of planning that is designed to restrict who can reside in certain dwellings in the countryside. Traditionally, it restricted the lawful occupancy of a dwelling to someone formally employed in agriculture, grazing of animals, working with animals on site for food or fur, growing or harvesting seeds (market gardener) or forestry.

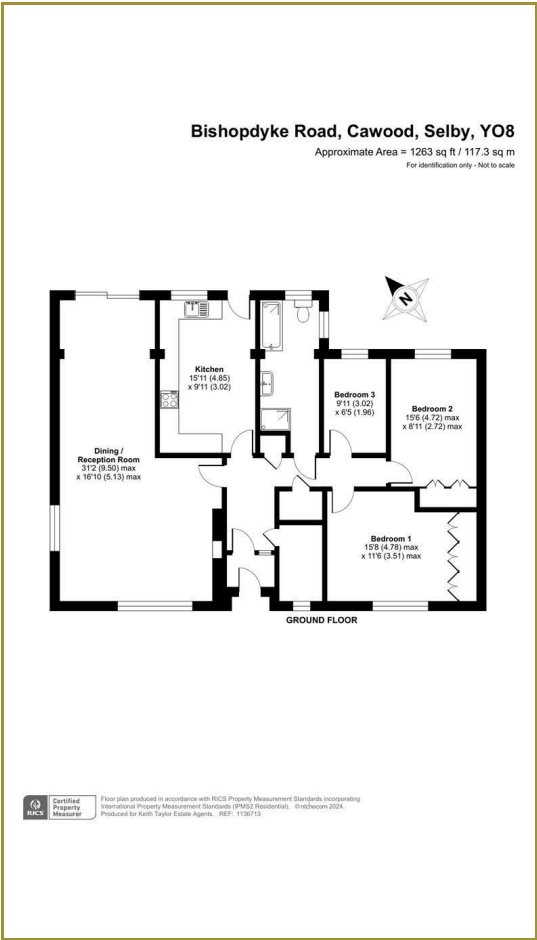

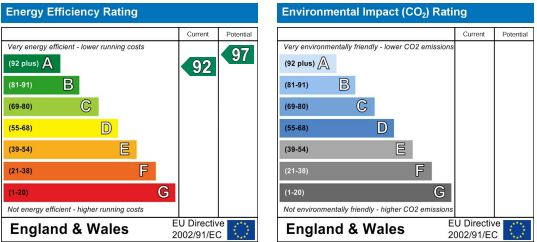
Area Map
