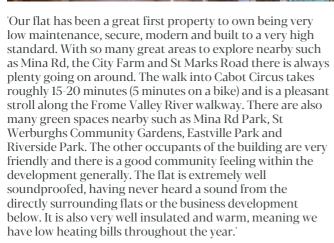


Boardwalk
