This is a compact, level and cleared site, with a frontage to front street of 10.2m approximately and a total site area of 570 sqm approximately. It is located in an area which has seen exceptional upgrading in recent years. It is well situated for access to village amenities, as well as good local bus services and access to the A19 and Peterlee.

Planning Permission

Planning permission has been granted by Durham County Council (DM/17/0284/OUT) for a larger development area around Sandgate Bungalow, and this parcel forms part. The plans shown demonstrate a number of examples of how this site can be developed. It would equally suit development as four semis or a terrace of houses or, alternatively, as two executive detached houses. All variations from the original planning permission will need to be applied for as a variation from the original planning. Interested parties are invited to make their own enquiries of Durham County Council.

We understand that all mains services are available to the site, but will be subject to the usual utility company connection charges.

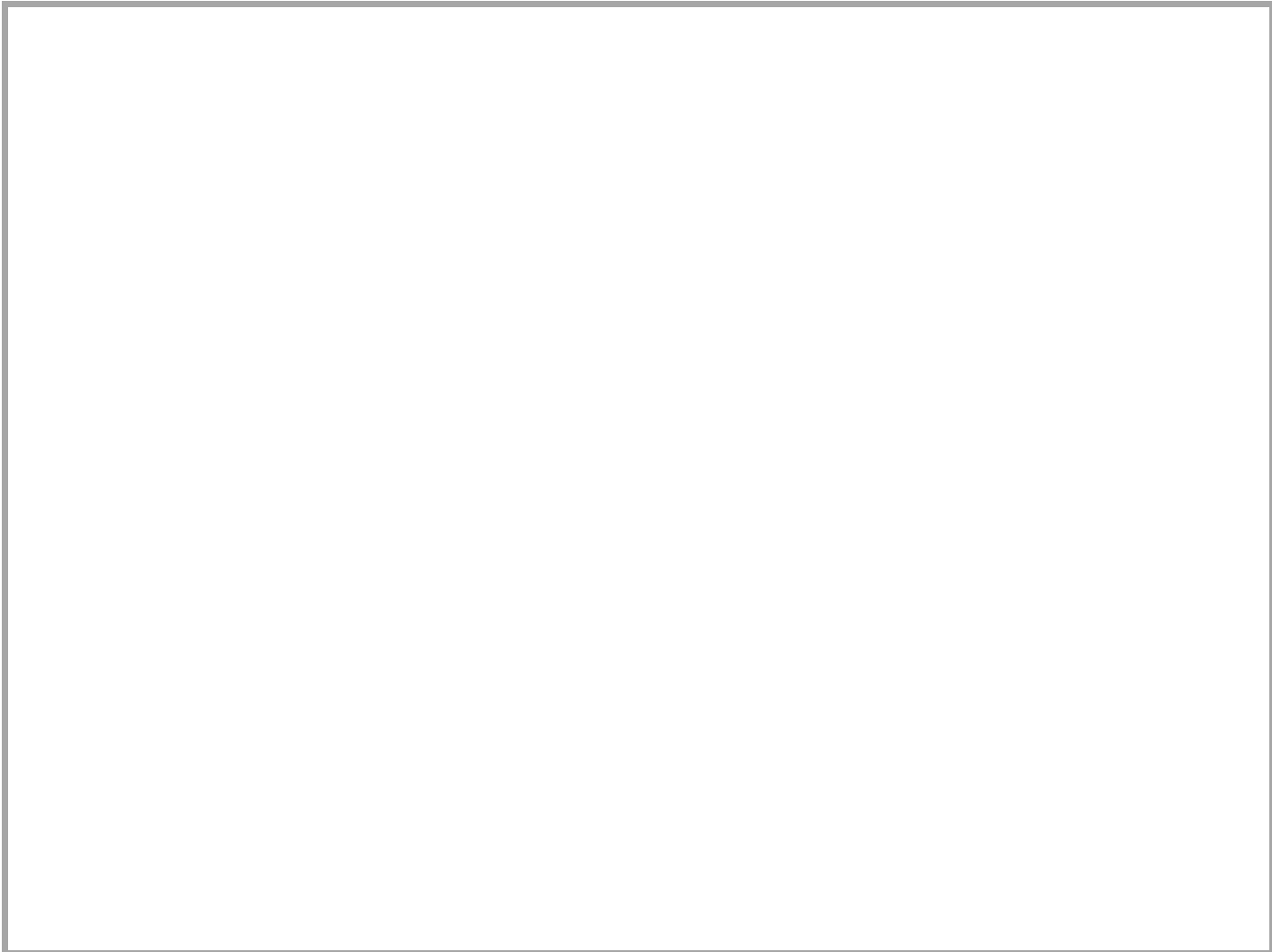
Reservation
